Staff can modify the Religious Education programmes of study for pupils with learning difficulties by: choosing material from earlier key stages maintaining, reinforcing, consolidating and generalising previous learning, as well as introducing new knowledge, skills and understanding using a syllabus and/or the guidelines as a resource, or to provide a context, in planning learning appropriate to the age and needs of pupils focusing on one aspect, or a limited number of aspects, in depth or in outline integrating, for pupils at the early stages of learning, RE with other subjects and as part of their everyday activities, including routines and shared events accessing RE through personal exploration and contact with a range of people providing a variety of learning environments and contexts in which content can be delivered 	 The impact of the Explore pathway provision is demonstrated through the development of students who are: The impact of the Explore and Primary SLD Pathway provision is demonstrated through the development of pupils who can make progress in RE: by moving from a personal to a wider perspective by increasing their knowledge of religious beliefs, practices and experiences through developing understanding of the meaning of stories, symbols, events and pictures through developing and communicating their individual responses to a range of views.
